Shared Governance

The College Council held its first annual retreat on Friday, August 5. The Council, comprised of representatives from all college constituency groups, met to assess initial progress and discuss plans for the upcoming year.

Of particular importance to Classified Staff was the discussion around Council attendance and equity around participation in shared governance. Shared governance can be a heavy lift for Classified members. Council participation requires not only attendance, but preparation for meetings. This message was communicated to the Council as a whole and CCE President. Anel Gonzalez, highlighted the need for Classified to receive adequate release time to effectively participate in shared governance. Vice President of Membership, Cheryl Kearse, emphasized: "Managers should not allow their Classified Staff to participate in shared governance, rather, they should encourage Classified Staff to participate." This communicates the importance of the Classified voice and reinforces administration's commitment to authentic shared governance at Palomar.

Another important point of discussion is that the Collective Bargaining Agreement (also known as the Contract or CBA) is a contract negotiated and agreed upon by the district AND the bargaining unit. The contract is not "owned" by CCE but represents the agreement between the District and Classified Staff about how Classified are to be treated in the workplace. This perspective removes the "us against them" narrative and encourages collaboration between college administration and unions. It also communicates a concern for workers' rights at Palomar College.

The Council also discussed the Comet Feedback network—Palomar's answer to a "suggestion box" for students and staff that can be found on Palomar's home page.

College Council continues its work this fall starting in September. All meeting agendas, minutes and materials may be viewed in Palomar's Board Docs platform.

Know your contract: 1. Rest Periods



The main role of CCE's COPE is to endorse and support candidates for Palomar's governing board. Three board seats are up for election in November, in district areas 1, 4, and 5.

Three seats constitute a majority of the board, and this election looks to be significant in terms of what's on the line. There are candidates for school boards across the nation whose agenda is to undermine and create chaos in public education at every level. The destabilizing potential of such candidates becoming a majority of Palomar's governing board is real. CCE's COPE will be active in the upcoming months helping to get candidates elected who are student-focused and have the very best qualifications we could hope for in our Trustees, who support workers, and who value the role of classified staff.

CCE and the Palomar Faculty Federation (PFF) have endorsed candidates in the three district areas up for election. Two of the candidates are incumbents and all three have worked successfully with community colleges, large budgets, and diverse groups while not allowing disruption and personal agendas to influence them. It is critical these candidates are elected to keep Palomar moving forward.

There are several ways you can help. One way is to find out if you or any of your friends and family live in districts where trustees are up for election and help to educate them about CCE endorsed candidates in these districts. Attend the CCE and PFF hosted meet & greet event with the candidates on Thursday, October 6, 4-7 pm, at Cocina Del Charro. Volunteer to canvas or phone bank in the month prior to the election. Finally, consider joining CCE's COPE by making a monthly contribution—as little as \$1 per month. COPE members vet and recommend candidates for CCE to endorse. a. 11.6.1 Employees shall be granted rest periods which, insofar as practicable, shall be in the middle of each work period at the rate of fifteen (15) minutes per four (4) hours worked or major fraction thereof. Rest periods shall be taken by employees after agreement with the immediate supervisor(s).



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
